


GET HEP A-WARE

Hepatitis A is an infection of the liver caused by the hepatitis A virus and is highly contagious.

People can spread hepatitis A even if they do not look or feel sick. Many children and some adults have no symptoms.



LEARN WHAT YOUR RISK FACTORS ARE — TALK TO YOUR PHARMACIST TODAY

Some, but not all, risk factors for acquiring or developing severe complications from hepatitis A infection include:



LIVER COMPLICATIONS OR OTHER DISEASES

Having a chronic liver disease such as hepatitis B or C, or having HIV



INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

Traveling to countries where hepatitis A is common, or having close personal contact with anybody from a high-risk region, such as an international adoptee



LOCAL OUTBREAKS

Living in a region where there is an outbreak and having one or more other risk factors



WORK ENVIRONMENTS

Working in spaces such as hepatitis A research laboratories and/or with hepatitis A-infected animals



PREGNANCY

Pregnancy, if at risk of infection or severe outcome from infection during pregnancy



HOUSING SITUATION

Homelessness
